Jerusalem (Zion) - the City of God

Psalm 48:2,3

Babylon – the City in rebellion to God

Genesis 11:4

As we shall see in later sessions, God works with a certain family to reveal His way on earth.


Sadly, they fail and seek also to rebel.

So God lets them be exiled to Babylon


There we meet the prophet Daniel......







Daniel is given a picture of world history to come from the viewpoint of Jerusalem, and who is in control of it.













Human Government in defiance of God

Statue - like an idol.

In Daniel it compares with the idol Nebuchadnezzar has made of himself: "....you must fall down and worship the image of gold that King Nebuchadnezzar has set up."

God says

Do not turn to idols or make metal gods for yourselves. I am the Lord your God. Leviticus 19:4

Beast - no longer human

In Daniel it compares with the illness
Nebuchadnezzar had in which he
becomes a beast for a while:
He was driven away from people and ate
grass like the ox.

God says

'Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over ... all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground.'

Genesis 1:26
















The Beast can do wonders, and many follow it

God remembered Babylon the Great and gave her the cup filled with the wine of the fury of his wrath.




Revelation 18:2

In Genesis 11 God stops them building the Tower, the Babylon system, until He has set up His own response: a people who will demonstrate His ways to the world.

He lets both grow together in order to demonstrate that the rebellion must fail and Man cannot survive without Him

In Revelation, Babylon is shown to have produced no fruit and is of no value; it totally fails

We shall look at the fall of Babylon more closely in Hour 10: Failure

- The spirit of 'building a name for ourselves' without God and in defiance of God
- Godless government in the world, particularly aimed at the seat of God in Jerusalem
- An overturning of God's purpose for humanity to have dominion over beasts
- It is an idol, worshipped instead of God
- It is fallen, for it will fall
- A doomed system
