Work through these notes yourself, not skimping on the study. If there are things you do not understand, ask someone. If you are asked questions you cannot answer then don't bluff your way through.


# "I don't know, I'll find out"

#### We need:

- \* JESUS at the centre of our lives, about which all else must revolve.
- \* SPOKES of the FOUR aspects of our lives,

# Prayer, Bible Reading, Fellowship, Witness.

\* The Holy Spirit filling us fully.

These notes, and the discussions you will have with them, will help you to understand these areas more fully.

We will consider each in turn.

## 1. JESUS

It is important for a Christian to know who Jesus is and to be sure of the central hub of their life.

Think firstly about these questions. You may find it helpful to jot down a few brief answers.

WHAT HAS JESUS DONE FOR YOU?
WHAT DID IT COST HIM?
WHY DID HE DO IT?
IS HE ALIVE NOW? HOW DO YOU KNOW?

Think and pray about these questions. Your relationship with Jesus depends on you knowing now how much you believe. Pray, too, he will teach you more as you go through this study.





The whole Bible relates more of Jesus to us. As you read it you will get to know Him better. The next study is on the topic of the Bible.

## THE BIBLE

What is it?

Why is it special? Who wrote it?

Why should we read it?

How can I understand it?

Is it out of date?

Can I trust it?

Some, or all of these questions may have gone through your mind. We need to look at the Bible itself for most of the answers. It is helpful to talk to other Christians about how the Bible has helped them. It's also useful to read books of famous Christians who trusted what the Bible said. e.g. Wesley, Whitefield, or Brother Andrew (God's Smuggler).

### WHAT is it?

Unless we come to terms with this question, we will not find our Bible Study that helpful.

The Bible says about itself.



2 TIMOTHY 3: 15-17

1 JOHN 5: 13

PSALM 119: 89

Frequently in the Bible we read, "And God said ..." or "The Lord said...." or "Jesus said....". The Bible is the Word of God. His message to each of us.

What does it say about how it was written?

2 PETER 1:21

It took thousands of years to write; by different 'authors'. Yet it reads like a book with a definite beginning and a happy conclusion.

Compare GENESIS 3: 23-24 with REVELATION 22: 1-5

The 'story' in between is that of a loving God who desires people to belong to Him, and how His Son had to die for this to be achieved. There is no doubt, as you read, that your conclusion will be "this was written by one person".

2 TIMOTHY 3: 16

### WHY should we read it?

We have already seen part of the answer: it is God's book. To follow Him we need to read His Book. It is not a meaningless, dull task to carry out.

See what He promises for doing it:

JOHN 20: 31

PSALM 119: 105

ACTS 20: 32

Spend some time reading through the whole of PSALM 119, noting the promises given for following God's word.

Read the Bible prayerfully, asking the Holy Spirit to teach you and to help you to understand. A good prayer is PSALM 119: 18

# **HOW should I read it?**

A thing worth doing is worth doing carefully. Pray about it first..... then:



JEREMIAH 15: 16

JAMES 1: 22

Note down what you learn: any promises given, commands to be obeyed. Pray again at the end, that God will help you to remember and apply what you have read. Try to memorise a few verses every week so that you can look them up when needed.

#### JESUS' ATTITUDE TO THE BIBLE

Jesus knew His scriptures. He memorised them, (Luke 4: 1-13), and knew their power to defeat Satan.

He believed them, even the bits we might find hard to believe.

MATTHEW 24: 37-39, LUKE 11: 30-32, etc.

#### There are THREE ways to spend time with the Bible:

- **1. READING.** Treat it like a book. Choose one of its 66 books and read it through. Get to know the whole Bible this way.
- 2. STUDY. Take a smaller section, a few verses or a paragraph or two. Treat it as if you had an exam to pass in it! Find out what God is saying to you though it. Is there an example to follow, a command to obey, or a promise to rely on? Look up any cross-references to other parts of the Bible. Write down everything that you think of as you study. Work through a book or a theme, day by day, in this way. Start with a Gospel, then Acts, then another Gospel, and then perhaps the books of Samuel. Don't study a book until you have read it through first! Get into the habit of sharing what you learn with other people.
- **3. MEMORISE.** If Jesus learnt scriptures by heart, then so should we! It's good to start with those that assure us of our 'salvation' and encourage us as Christians. Learn the reference as well as the words: *USE A MODERN TRANSLATION*.

# Is the Bible out of Date?

No! As you get to know it you will discover it full of teaching on every aspect of life. It is a complicated book, God's revelation to humanity.

REVELATION 22: 18-19

As archaeologists have discovered more and more in the Middle East, they have repeatedly confirmed the Bible to be accurate. NOTHING discovered has ever disputed the Bible. On the contrary, it has always found to be a totally reliable record of people and places of the past.

FINALLY: You may not at this moment be in a position to honestly say, "I believe the Bible totally". God does not expect that, but He does expect you to be teachable. Pray that God will, by His Spirit, reveal more and more of His truth to you. Faith is a gift from God, not something we work up ourselves.

## 3. PRAYER

What is prayer?
Why bother, when God knows everything anyway?
It's so boring!

## WHAT is Prayer?

Simply, it is talking to God, and listening to Him! It's a two-way conversation, and involves:-

# WORSHIP CONFESSION INTERCESSION

## **WORSHIP**



Worship or praise, is giving ourselves to announce how greatly we love, appreciate and want, God. It does not just involve singing.

See how others have worshipped. (Note down what they did).

Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your worship. Remember the things Jesus has done for you especially His death. Imagine Him on the throne next to the Father, with all Heaven worshipping. Thank Him for all He means to you, and get carried away! Sometimes it is easier than others, but do it anyway. Then when you join with others to sing and praise it will be a much more natural part of your Christian life.

## CONFESSION

As we gaze upon the Holiness of God, we recognise our own sin, guilt and worthlessness. Only in Jesus are we made clean. It is right to confess those things we know to be wrong. Not just as a ritual, but real *REPENTANCE*, desiring never to do them again. We also recognise that we are sinful and unable ever to be pure, save through Jesus!

Notice especially verse 1. It is not because of us that we are forgiven, but because we worship a God who is merciful and loves to forgive.

#### INTERCESSION

Literally, 'standing in the gap'. Intercession involves us inviting God into situations in our lives and the live of others. We can intercede for our families, our friends, our nation, the world and ourselves. Not only can we, but we must.

1 SAMUEL 12: 23

God makes promises to us when we intercede.

JOHN 16: 24

MATTHEW 7: 7-11

Intercession is a big topic, and worth more consideration than space allows here. It is one of the important tasks given to Christians. Without it, God cannot get involved!

#### WHY DO WE NEED TO INTERCEDE?

Read GENESIS 2: 15 and GENESIS 1: 26-30

God made people, placed them on the earth to guard and control it. Older Bible versions say, "have dominion over it"!

Effectively, God said, "You're in charge, I won't interfere!"

So, God cannot get involved unless invited to by people. That's why it is vital that we, God's people. invite Him to be involved! Pray for those around you, things you're interested in, you school/job, and the nation.

# WHEN to Pray?

Jesus gave us an example: -

MARK 1: 35

"Very early in the morning", may not be the best time for you, but notice that Jesus made sure He was alone and undisturbed.

In modern jargon this is called a QUIET TIME .....

.....BUT THAT'S NOT ALL!

#### **BUT IT'S SO BORING!**

Yes it is, if prayer is only reeling off a long list of requests to God. I hope you have seen by now that that is not all. Use your imagination to worship God. Pray at the best time of day. (God is more important than TV, food, even homework!)

Write down the things you pray for, in a diary, and look out for the answers. **Then praise God for them**.

In the last section of this booklet we will be considering the difference the Holy Spirit makes to us. That will include our praying.

ANYTHING WORTH DOING IS DIFFICULT AT TIMES, DON'T GIVE UP

Get into the habit of praying with other people, especially your helper.

Jesus promises us:-

BE SPECIFIC!


You'll never see answers if you pray "God bless so and so....." pray for their needs specifically, so that you can see when prayer is answered!

# 5. WITNESS

Why should I tell others? I don't want to be labelled a freak! Religion should be private.

#### HOW to tell others

You may not be good at explaining things..... You may not be good at winning arguments.....

BUT YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE!

Re-read MATTHEW 5: 13-16

You are like salt, you are like light. Christ has already done this in you. People will be attracted to God in you because of the difference He makes as His Holy Spirit enriches your life. What differences?

GALATIANS 5: 22-23

There are other differences too: -

As we fellowship with other Christians

JOHN 13: 34

At work

COLOSSIANS 3: 22-25

You may not feel that it is possible at the moment. You may not even want it to be, if so, ask God to "change your mind" and He will.

See ROMANS 12: 1-2

So, God speaks through our lives and we support this with words. We were not saved just for ourselves, but to bring others to God. There is no greater thrill on earth than seeing someone you have prayed for becoming a Christian.

That is the key! **YOU** will **never** convert anyone. Only the Holy Spirit can do that, and He does it as we pray. Pray for people. Pray for opportunities to talk about Jesus. Know what the message of Good News is. And keep praying!

## 6. THE HOLY SPIRIT

We've mentioned Him quite a lot so far! Who is He? What is His purpose in your life? How does He help?

FIRSTLY, there is only one God.

He reveals Himself to us in three ways: -

as Father Almighty, Creator of the earth and universe

as Jesus Christ, God yet Man. Saviour of all who trust in Him.

as the Holy Spirit, or the Presence of God on earth today.

Yes, it is confusing. But just as 'H<sub>2</sub>O' can reveal itself as solid, liquid or gas, all of which are pure water, so God reveals Himself in different ways.

So: the Holy Spirit is God. He is described in different ways in the Bible. Note down what these verses say about Him. (What He is like and/or what He gives to us).



## WHEN DO I RECEIVE THE HOLY SPIRIT?

When you become a Christian

ROMANS 8: 9-11

ROMANS 8: 15-17

From that moment on He is the 'tyre' of your life/wheel. Yet we may still have a bumpy ride! If Jesus is not at the centre, then our life will not be rigid in God. If the most important thing is, say, football or our boy/girl friend, or TV or money, then we do not have a solid hub! If we neglect prayer, the Bible, fellowship or witness, then our 'tyre' will be out of shape and life will be full of ups and downs.

Even if we have all those things, we need the 'tyre' fully blown up! From the day you become a Christian the Holy Spirit lives in you, but he wants total possession! He wants you fully inflated!

Are you ready to let Him have ALL parts of your life, to do with as he wants? If you are, then you will see the fruit growing quickly. (GALATIANS 5: 22-23)

### **BUT YOU CAN EXPECT MORE!**

God filling us in our lives



He helps you to pray.

He helps you to witness.
