

These additional questions are to help you to get your group talking, but do not be constrained by them. If you have your own questions they are more likely to be relevant to your group and your context than these.

There are not necessarily right answers to any of the questions, the aim of the study is to engage with the scriptures and for God to speak to the people present and the group as a whole. He will be emphasising different things in different places and situations.

In many studies there are too many questions for most groups, so some time beforehand thinking and praying abut which are the best questions to use is always important.

STUDY 1a page 1 Ephesians Chapter 1:1-14 (modernisedAV)

Additional suggested questions to help you to get the most out of your group

Lead Question

Supplementary Questions

Paul confidently call himself Apostle, how do you describe yourself? Do you see yourself as God sees you?

Do we think of ourselves in different ways depending on which relationships we are thinking about (family, work, church, etc)?

How do you think God would describe you?

Who is this letter addressed to?

How would you address a letter to your church?

An individual? A group?

Which words might you use to collectively describe the people in it?

Is he using the word saints in the way we might use it today?

"Count your blessings" Can you list the ways in which we are blessed?

Which blessings are you particularly aware of?

Where are our blessings?

See how long a list you can gather between you. Some will be day to day things such as health (for some!), others will be spiritual promises given by God. All are valid!

Who does the us & we refer to?
To whom was the letter addressed (see v1)? Is it me the individual who was predestined or is it the body of saints corporately?

What does the idea of God having a plan for our lives mean to members of the group?

Do we ever think of that plan as being for us together as the Church, or do we only see it as an individual thing?

Redemption: "re-purchase, as of something sold"

See Psalm 103 v 4. Redeemed and then Crowned.

What/who were we sold to?

Does the idea of redemption shape our worship or our lives, or is it a concept we don't think about?

What were we bought back from?

Why did Jesus have to shed blood and die in order to redeem us?

If God has already abounded grace to us, why does Paul pray in verse

"Grace be to you"?

Grace...Redeemed and the Crowned undeservedly

Does God's grace stop at redemption?

In what other ways does God continue to show us grace?

How can we pass grace on to others?

What is our inheritance?

What other things does the Bible include in our inheritance? (a concordance might be handy here, or go to www.biblegateway.com and look up the word inheritance)

Discuss, then see Genesis 15:1

Is this inheritance something for today, or just for eternity?

What is our purpose?

Do we have to have a purpose in life?

How do we achieve this?

Does it matter if it is not directly related to God (ie, are all jobs valid for Christians)?

Or does He do it all in us and for us?

As long as we are 'committed to God', do we have to do anything more in order to fulfill His will?

Were we saved before the foundation of the world or when we

believed?

The process in verse 13 is we hear the Word of Truth, we believe it and then we are sealed with the Holy Spirit. Where would members of the group say they each were in that process (if they wish to)?

What do you think it means for God to have chosen us before the foundation of

the world?

If you put down a deposit on a house or car what does it mean? Is it yours to use yet? What are you
