33 PROPHECIES FULFILLED IN ONE DAY

1. The betrayal of the Lord Jesus Christ by Iudas Iscariot.

Psalm 41:9, "Yea, mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, which did eat of My bread, hath lifted up his heel against Me."

Mark 14:10, "And Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve, went unto the chief priests, to betray Him unto them."

2. The Lord Jesus Christ forsaken by His disciples.

Zechariah 13:7, "Awake O sword, against My Shepherd, and against the Man that is My Fellow, saith the Lord of hosts: smite the Shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered: and I will turn Mine hand upon the little ones.

Mark 14:50, "And they all forsook Him and fled."

3. The price of the Lord's betrayal was foretold.

Zechariah 11:12, "And I said unto them, if ye think good, give Me My price, and if not, forbear. So they weighed for My price thirty pieces of silver."

Matthew 26:15, "And said unto them, what will ye give me, and I will deliver Him unto you? And they convenanted with him for thirty pieces of silver.

4. What would be done with the betrayal money.

Zechariah 11:13, "And the Lord said unto me, Cast it unto the potter: a goodly price that I was prised at of them. And I took the thirty pieces of silver, and cast them to the potter in the house of the Lord."

Matthew 27:3-7, "Then Judas, which had betrayed Him, when he saw that he was condemned, repented himself, and brought again the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, Saying, I have sinned in that I have betrayed the Innocent Blood. And they said, What is that to us? See thou to that. And he cast down the pieces of silver in the temple, and departed, and went and hanged himself. And the chief priests took the silver pieces, and said, It is not lawful for to put them into the treasury, because it is the price of blood. And they took counsel, and bought with them the potter's field, to bury strangers in.

5. The prophecy concerning the Lord's scourging.

Isaiah 50:6, "I gave My back to the smiters, and My cheeks to them that plucked off the hair, I hid not My face from shame and spitting."

Matt 27:26, 30, "Then released he Barabbas unto them: and when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered Him to be crucified."

"And they spit upon Him, and took the reed, and smote Him on the head."

6. The prophecy of shame, reproach, and dishonor of our Lord.

Psalm 69:19, "Thou hast known My reproach, and My shame, and My dishonour: Mine adversaries are all before thee."

Matthew 27:28, "And they stripped Him, and put on Him a scarlet robe."

7. The false witnesses against the Lord Jesus Christ.

Psalm 35:11, "False witnesses did rise up; they laid to My charge things that I knew not."

Mark 14:56, "For many bare false witness against Him, but their witness agreed not together."

8. The prophecy of the smitten Shepherd.

Zechariah 13:7, "Awake, O sword, against My Shepherd, and against the Man that is My Fellow, saith the Lord of hosts: smite the Shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered: and I will turn Mine hand upon the little ones."

Matthew 26:31, "Then saith Jesus unto them, All ye shall be offended because of Me this night: for it is written, I will smite the Shepherd, and the sheep of the flock shall be scattered abroad."

9. The parting of the Lord's garments.

Psalm 22:18, "They parted My garments among them, and cast lots upon My vesture."

John 19:24, "They said therefore, among themselves, Let us not rend it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the Scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, They parted My raiment among them, and for My vesture they did cast lots. These things therefore the soldiers did."

10. The Lord would not open His mouth.

- Isaiah 53:7, "He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth: He is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so He openeth not His mouth."
- Matt 27:13, 14, "Then said Pilate unto Him, Hearest Thou not how many things they witness against Thee? And He answered him to never a word; insomuch that the governor marvelled greatly."

11. The Saviour's crucifixion.

- Isa 53:5, 6, 10, "But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed."

 "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

 "Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise Him; He hath put Him to grief: when thou shalt make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, and the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand."
- Luke 23:33, "And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified Him, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left."
- John 19:16, "Then delivered he Him therefore unto them to be crucified. And they took Jesus, and led Him away.

12. The Lord falling beneath the Cross.

- Psalm 109:24, "My knees are weak through fasting; and My flesh faileth of fatness."
- John 19:17, "And He bearing His cross went forth into a place called the place of a skull, which is called in the Hebrew Golgotha."
- Matthew 27:32, "And as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name: him they compelled to bear His Cross."

13. The Lord's thirst.

- Psalm 69;3, "I am weary of My crying: My throat is dried: Mine eyes fail while I wait for My God."
- Psalm 69:21, "They gave Me also gall for My meat; and in My thirst they gave Me vinegar to drink."
- John 19:28, "After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst."

14. Giving Him something to drink.

- Psalm 69:21, "They gave Me also gall for My meat; and in My thirst they gave Me vinegar to drink."
- Matthew 27:34, "They gave Him vinegar to drink mingled with gall: and when He had tasted thereof, He would not drink."
- John 19:29, "Now there was set a vessel full of vinegar: and they filled a sponge with vinegar, and put it upon hyssop, and put it to His mouth."

15. They stared at Jesus Christ on the Cross.

- Psalm 22:17, "I may tell all My bones: they look and stare upon Me."
- Matthew 27:36, "And sitting down they watched Him there."

16. They pierced His hands and feet.

- Psalm 22:16, "For dogs have compassed Me: the assembly of the wicked have inclosed Me: they pierced My hands and My feet."
- Matthew 27:35, "And they crucified Him, and parted His garments, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, They parted My garments among them, and upon My vesture did they cast lots."

17. They pierced His side.

- Zechariah 12:10, "And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the spirit of Grace and of supplications: and they shall look upon Me whom they have pierced, and they shall mourn for Him, as one mourneth for his only son, and shall be in bitterness for Him, as one that is in bitterness for his firstborn."
- John 19:34, "But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced His side, and forthwith came there out blood and water."

18. His heart was broken.

- Psalm 22:14, "I am poured out like water, and all My bones are out of joint: My heart is like wax; it is melted in the midst of My bowels."
- Hebrews 5:7, "Who in the days of His flesh, when He had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto Him that was able to save Him from death, and was heard in that He feared."

19. His mother and friends at the Cross.

Psalm 38:11, "My lovers and My friends stand aloof from My sore; and My kinsmen stand afar off."

Luke 23:49, "And all His acquaintance, and the women that followed Him from Galilee, stood afar off, beholding these things."

20. The mockery of the people.

Psalm 109:25, "I became also a reproach unto them: when they looked upon Me they shaked their heads."

Matt 27:30, 39, "And they spit upon Him, and took the reed, and smote Him on the head."

"And they that passed by reviled Him, wagging their heads."

21. The taunting by the mob.

Psalm 22:8, "He trusted on the Lord that He would deliver Him; let Him deliver Him, seeing He delighted in Him."

Matthew 27:43, "He trusted in God; let Him deliver Him now, if He will have Him: for He said, I am the Son of God."

22. The Lamb of God.

Isaiah 53:7, "He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth: He is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so He openeth not His mouth."

John 1:29, "The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto Him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world."

23. His intercession for the transgressors.

Isaiah 53:12, "Therefore will I divide Him a portion with the great, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong; because He hath poured out His soul unto death: and He was numbered with the transgressors; and He bare the sins of many, and made intercession for the transgressors."

Luke 23:34, "Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. And they parted His raiment, and cast lots."

24. Crying in the midnight hour.

Psalm 22:1, "My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me? Why art Thou so far from helping Me, and from the words of My roaring?"

Matthew 27:46, "And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?"

25. His marred visage.

Isaiah 52:14, "As many were astonied at Thee; His visage was so marred more than any man, and His form more than the sons of men."

John 19:5, 14, "Then came Jesus forth, wearing the crown of thorns, and the purple robe. And Pilate saith unto them, Behold the man!"

"And it was the preparation of the Passover, and about the sixth hour: and he saith unto the Jews, Behold your King!"

Matthew 27:30, "And they spit upon Him, and took the reed, and smote Him on the head."

26. Victory and triumph.

Psalm 22:31, "They shall come, and shall declare His righteousness unto a people that shall be born, that He hath done this."

John 19:30, "When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, He said, It is finished: and He bowed His head, and gave up the Spirit."

27. Dismissed His Spirit to His Father.

Psalm 31:5, "Into Thine hand I commit My Spirit: Thou hast redeemed Me, O Lord God of Truth."

Luke 23:46, "And when Jesus had cried with a loud voice, He said, Father, into Thy hands I commend My Spirit: and having said thus, He gave up the Spirit."

28. No bones of His body would be broken.

Exodus 12:46, "In one house shall it be eaten; thou shalt not carry forth ought of the flesh abroad out of the house; neither shall ye break a bone thereof."

John 19:33, 36, "But when they came to Jesus, and saw that He was dead already, they brake not His legs." "For these things were done that the Scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of Him shall not be broken."

29. He was numbered with the transgressors.

Isaiah 53:12, "Therefore will I divide Him a portion with the great, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong; because He hath poured out His soul unto death: and He was numbered with the transgressors; and He bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors."

Luke 23:33, "And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified Him, and the malefactors, one on the right, and the other on the left."

30. Messiah was cut off but not for Himself.

Daniel 9:26, "After threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not for Himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined."

John 11:50, 52, "Nor consider that it is expedient for us, that one Man should die for the people, and that the whole nation perish not."

"And not for that nation only, but that also He should gather together in one the children of God that were scattered abroad."

31. The conflict of the Cross.

Genesis 3:15, "And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her Seed; It shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise His heel."

John 12:31-33, "Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out.

And I, if I be lifted up from the Earth, will draw all men unto Me. This He said, signifying what death He should die."

Romans 16:20, "And the God of peace shall bruise Satan under your feet shortly. The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. Amen."

John 19:18, "Where they crucified Him, and two other with Him, on either side one, and Jesus in the midst."

32. His place of burial.

Isaiah 53:9, "And He made His grave with the wicked, and with the rich in His death; because He had done no violence, neither was any deceit in His mouth."

Matt 27:57-60, "When the even was come, there came a rich man of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple: He went to Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be delivered. And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth. And laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock; and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed."

33. The sun would go down.

Amos 8:9, "And it shall come to pass in that day, saith the Lord God, that I will cause the sun to go down at noon, and I will darken the Earth in the clear day."

Matthew 27:45, "Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land unto the ninth hour."
